FROM THE SECRETARY'S TABLE

Greetings Friends and Brothers,

I hope everyone is doing well, and that everyone is healthy and safe. The Stay at Home Orders are gradually being relaxed, but as of yet there are still no Masonic Gatherings taking place. The Lodge Officers did meet on June 3, 2020 via Video Conference and worked through some of the essential business of the lodge. Bills were ordered to be paid, and a few other issues were dealt with. Part of which is what happens when we open? The Grand Master has recently spoken regarding when will we open. We have been informed by the State that Masonic Lodges and Grand Lodge are in Phase 4 of the reopening.

That means we are probably next to last in line in which to open. I believe we are ahead of sports venues full of fans. Of course, opening could be delayed if the state experiences a significant spike in cases and deaths so it remains a fluid situation.

When we do open there will be changes as to the way we do things. Social Distancing will be the new norm, and we at Morning Star will take the necessary steps to keep the brethren and our families safe. We will be able to have Stated Meetings but Stated Meeting Dinners will either not occur or be modified to provide for social distancing and safety. I personally believe that we will be able to still serve dinner, but we are working through those solutions so that they are done safely and in compliance with State and Grand Lodge directions.

The things that we do when we meet will also change. According to the Grand Master, because of the way that our ritual is performed it does not comply with social distancing requirements. The Grand Master indicated

that he is not going to provide a special dispensation to change the ritual. First, if he did change the ritual, he feels that he would dilute the ritual of its meaning and not make it nearly as effective. Secondly, he does not feel that he has the power to change the ritual as that is a province for the brethren to vote on at the Annual Communication (Grand Lodge). Therefore, degrees and other rituals requiring close contact or touching will not be allowed.

Before we can open, we will have to file a plan for re-opening with the State. Our plan will have to provide for social distancing, meals, and how we will conduct meetings. There may also be a maximum attendance requirement as well. Grand Lodge will provide a template for the Lodge plan in the next couple of weeks and we will begin work on it immediately. This template may further define the rules and give us some guidance as to the form of the report to file with the state.

I realize that everyone has a feeling regarding the restrictions that are upon us. However, we are bound by the laws of the State and the Orders of the Grand Master. Some of the changes will not be so popular, and the Officers of Morning Star understand that. However, the safety and health of our brothers and families are paramount on our minds, and any action that we take will be with that interest in mind. We will keep you up to date the best we can, and we will try to keep our operations as close to normal as we can.

Until then, please stay vigilant and watch over each other..

I-MEMBER 2.0: WHY DO I CARE?

On July 1, 2020; Grand Lodge will unveil the newest version of i-Member, which is a web based member management system. Prior to the development of this system i-Member was only available to the Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Inspector and other Grand Lodge Officers. iMember 2.0 will change that

Beginning July 1, iMember 2.0 will be available to all members. What you can see, of course depends on who you are. For example, Secretaries will see more than an average member and the officers of the Lodge. Other officers and Grand Lodge Staff will have greater access depending on what their position is. iMember 2.0 promises to be an easy to use system that will allow a member of Morning Star 19 to log onto the site and look up their profile. They will be able to make changes to their profile (such as when they move or change phone numbers and e-mail addresses. iMember 2.0 will allow you to not only update your profile. You will be able to pay your dues online using the square or credit card. You can make those dues payments in monthly installments if you choose, or they can be a lump sum payment. You can also RSVP to dinners and events and pay for them through Grand Lodge. Once you do pay your dues it is no longer necessary to wait for the secretary to send your dues card in the mail. It will be available for you on the site and you can download it to your smart phone or print it. However, if you prefer to have me mail you your dues card, I will be happy to do so.

Yours Truly (that would be me) will also have an easier time using iMember 2.0. Grand Lodge promises that with an easier to use dashboard my job will become easier by enabling me to be able to communicate with you sending mass e-mails, robo-calls and merge mail. To our widows and other friends of the Lodge I will continue to keep my e-mail lists so that I will be able to notify you of upcoming events and other announcements.

If you would like to explore the system you can log in and work with it either with expert guidance or at your own pace. Here is how you do it:

AT YOUR OWN PACE

Log in to: https://membertest.freemason.org/membeship_regisration

Log into the test site using your own credentials.

-Use the Help Desk to navigate the site and learn tips for success.

FOR THE GUIDED WEBINAR

Log in to: https://membertest.freemason.org/membership_registration

(Training webinars with platform experts are held weekly.)

Log into the test site using your own credentials.

-Click on "My Portal"

-Select the "Seminars" tile, and choose the day and time you prefer.

Be sure to register for webinars at least a day in advance. They generally run about 40 minutes to an hour.

I know that new things frighten us all, but this new version will allow all of us to be more interactive with the system and have control over our information. It will also make it easier to take care of dues and keep your information updated.

I will keep you informed as I learn more.

A MESSAGE FROM MOST WORSHIPFUL JOHN TRAUNER

Dear Brethren,

It's clear from the past week that the world is longing for higher ideals – more unity, harmony, and focus on the common good. Freemasons have been champions of these ideas for centuries. The principles of brotherly love, relief, and truth; of temperance, fortitude, prudence, and justice have never been more vital. First, it is important for us to reflect on these values. And second, as modern Masons, it's our duty to display the best of these ideals in our daily lives; to be a good example for our families and neighbors. It's what called us to Masonry in the first place. And being together is an important part of cementing our brotherhood and unity as Masons.

It's been some 80 days since we suspended Masonic meetings and events to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission among our members and communities and to adhere to subsequent state and local orders to stay at home. These orders are being updated to allow greater economic, medical, educational, and religious activities to safely resume. The California Department of Public Health recognizes that "meetings or other events that bring together persons from multiple households at the same time for a shared or group experience in a single room, space, or place pose an especially great danger of transmission and spread of COVID-19." The state updated this guidance for religious and faith based organizations on May 25. However, social gatherings like ours are not yet permitted. I'm developing plans with the executive committee so that we are prepared to issue guidance for the safe resumption of Masonic meetings and events when the time is right.

When state and local government agree that activities like ours are permitted, we should be prepared to gradually resume our activities, avoiding those aspects of our practices that might not be best to undertake initially. Local Masonic leaders should think about a plan to address the safety of our activities. Each lodge will be expected to have a written plan in place before activities resume. We'll issue a template for lodge plans soon. In the meantime, look through state or county resources for re-opening guidelines. These guidelines tend to be similar across all sectors and we believe guidelines for our activities will be similar. State guidelines can be found here.

There isn't yet sufficient information to determine if the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge will be permitted to take place in October as planned. We hope more information will be available in the weeks ahead. We've made contingency plans if we're not be able to conduct the Annual Communication in person. These plans are based on existing Masonic law and will allow us to conduct the essential business of the grand lodge, including the normal succession of leadership. We'll announce these plans once we're able to make a final decision about the Annual Communication.

Though we're not able to meet in person, we can continue to shine the light of Freemasonry in our lives. I continue to be awed by the generosity of Masons. The response to the Distressed Worthy Brother Relief Fund is incredible. We're helping over 120 brothers and their families who have been seriously impacted by the pandemic. If you know of a brother who needs help, please direct him to Masonic Assistance. And, I'm thrilled to report that our California Masonic Foundation has brought together some of our favorite community partners – Raising A Reader and the Major League Baseball foundations – to help children and families across the state. Next month, we'll distribute Super Summer Book Bags filled with learning resources to thousands of California families, addressing a growing


educational challenge known as the "COVID-slide." Learn more about how you can help our communities through this important and vital effort on Masons4Mitts.org in the coming weeks.
