Happy Holidays Brethren and Family,

The weather is finally cooling off! As the season... becomes seasonal, I would like to point out that seasonal foods are usually the best. We all enjoy the summer ripened strawberries and melons, especially with the abundance that we are lucky to have here in the valley. Come late fall, we traditionally have the Thanksgiving feast, which is still a type of harvest festival.

Here at Morning Star Lodge, we need to change with the times, and like last month, we will continue to host the drive through dinners in place of our Stated dinners; we will be having a lighter course of the usual Thanksgiving staples of ham with sides. Be sure to make your reservation for it!

What is also seasonal for this time of year is plenty of traditional fruits. Pomegranates are ripened, full of juicy seeds, packed with antioxidants. Asian pears are plenty, with their anti-inflammatory effects. A traditional cold remedy is to half an Asian pear, scoop out the core, and place a dab of honey in its place, and bake lightly. The resulting concoction is a sweet folk medicine for coughs and sore throats. An old wives' tale about Asian pears is that it helps keep moisture in the body, particularly the skin for some mild anti-aging effects. Dates are also in season, both the Middle Eastern kind and the Chinese dates are fantastic digestion promoting fruits. A few of either goes a long way. In Asia, Hawthorn berries, which are almost apple sized, are also seasonal in fall, and they have a particular feature of promoting digestion of meats; perfect for harvest festivals.

While the fall harvest isn't as romantic as the cherry blossoms in spring, they do have their place in our diets as the weather usually gets dryer and the flu season starts up. As the weather transitions from temperate to that welcoming winter chill, I encourage everybody to stay safe, and we will soon be able to meet again as a fraternity.

7. To Access your Membership Page (where all of your information is) go back to the "My

Portal" page. Click on "My Portal" box at the top of the page.

- 8. Go to "My Profile" Box
- 9. On the left side of the page you will see a series of headings like "Personal Information" click on the headings to verify your information such as address, phone number, E-Mail and so forth. You can also add membership in Concordant Bodies, awards and other information. You can also send me a photograph and I will be happy to load it onto your page, or you can do it if you like. - 10. You will see a section that discusses "My Preferences" this is how Morning Star #19 can




