GREETINGS BROTHERS OF MORNING STAR LODGE Brethren,



Hello everyone,

I hope everyone had a great summer. While Morning Star was for the most part dark for the months of July and August there has been a lot going on. If all goes well, we will have had a degree and initiated a new brother. I would offer my congratulations, but I do not want to jinx it. So....next month.

The line of Officers has been participating and practicing to "step up" to their new positions (if elected). It takes a lot of effort and a lot of practice to get there and trust me it is not as easy as you think.

Speaking of "stepping up" if anyone is interested in getting involved in the line of officers, or even serving on a committee get in touch with Worshipful Tao or myself and we can get you involved. Getting involved in a committee involves less commitment than getting in the Officers Line. Depending on the committee will depend on the level of your commitment. The lodge has three mandatory committees that according to the Masonic Code must be formed (the Auditing Committee, the Charitable Committee and the Membership Retention Committee) however there are others such as the Trestle Board, Social Media, Membership and events such as the Hiram Award and others.

We'll see you at Round Table in September.


